# GRADUATING WITH HONORS

Students who score at or above all the subject area benchmarks on the ACT or equivalent will graduate with honors.

#### GRADUATING WITH DISTINCTION

Students will be recognized as graduating with distinction by attaining a B average and completing at least one of the following:

- Earn a national recognized industry certification
- Participate in at least one of the Governor's Schools
- Participate in at least one of the state's All State music organizations
- Be selected as a National Merit Finalist or Semi-Finalist
- Attain a score of 31 or higher composite score on the ACT
- Attain a score of 3 or higher on at least two advanced placement exams
- Earn 12 or more semester hours of transcripted postsecondary credits

### **CLASS RANKING**

- Final grade average earned in each class in grades 9, 10, 11, and the first semester of grade 12 are used in determining final class standing. This standing is based on a combination of Grade Point Average (GPA) and the Quality Point Average (QPA).
- GPA calculations will now be called Lottery GPA and Local Weighted GPA. The Lottery GPA will be based on a 4.0 scale. The Local Weighted GPA will be based on a 5.0 scale. Teachers will continue to add additional points to the final grade of the course, and the following guidelines will be adhered to:
  - o Honors courses will receive .5 additional quality points.
  - o Statewide dual credit course will receive .75 additional quality points.
  - AP and Dual enrollment courses will receive 1 additional quality point.
- Students will be eligible for the HOPE scholarship IF they receive a 21 on their ACT or have a 3.0 GPA at the end of their senior year.
- The TN Promise scholarship is available to all TN High School graduates who complete requirements (tnpromise.gov). This is a last dollar scholarship, which covers tuition and fees at any TCAT or TN Community College.

# COMMUNITY SERVICE RECOGNITION

Students completing at least ten hours of community service, each semester they are in attendance at a public high school, shall be recognized at graduation.
